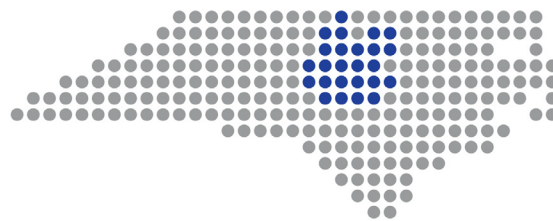


Durham-Chapel Hill and Raleigh-Cary, NC

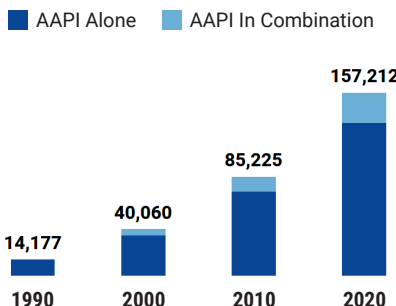

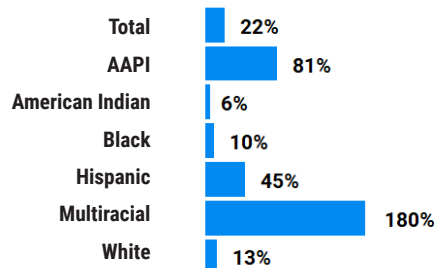

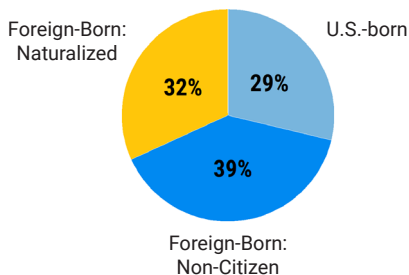

Citizenship Status of Asian and Pacific Islander Population, 2019



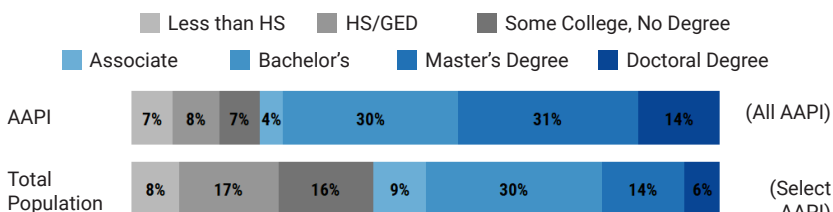
